FMC ACTIVITY UPDATE

FMC was established as the Canadian Farm Business Management Council in 1992 following the financial crisis of the 1980s where interest rates spiked and commodity prices bottomed out, leaving some farmers high and dry. For over 25 years, FMC has worked to increase awareness and adoption of farm business management practices to equip Canada's farmers with the tools to weather the storm, confront change with confidence and seize opportunity.

BOARD AND GOVERNANCE

The Board of Directors met in November in conjunction with the Agricultural Excellence Conference in Winnipeg. Given the delay in securing funds under the new policy framework, FMC has kept expenses low to manage cash flow, and has been concentrating on partnership development and raising the profile of FMC and farm business management, instead of program delivery. The Board had decided to go through with the annual AgEx Conference regardless of AAFC funding. FMC took part in a number of industry engagement sessions with the Standing Committee and others, and has secured a number of industry presentations including FCC, the Pacific Ag Show, FarmTech and co-hosting a Risk Management education symposium with AAFC in Ottawa in March.

It was at this meeting that FMC received a 3-year Contribution Agreement from Agriculture & Agri-Food Canada under the Canadian Agricultural Partnership (CAP), AgriCompetitiveness Program. The Board reviewed planned activities under CAP and FMC's capacity to fulfill obligations given the significant delay in securing an Agreement. The Board also reviewed and approved an Emergency Leadership Plan and Leadership Succession Plan for the organization. The Board discussed ideas to bring FMC towards greater financial independence. And, moving towards a 3-3-3 Director turnover model to provide greater stability within the Board. The Board also discussed FMC's messaging and the idea of incorporating more risk management terminology as well as the concept of healthy farmer: healthy farm into its messaging to appeal to farmer audiences.

THE CANADIAN AGRICULTURAL PARTNERSHIP

The Canadian Agricultural Partnership (CAP) program commenced April 1, 2018. On November 26, FMC secured a 3-year Contribution Agreement from Agriculture & Agri-Food Canada under the AgriCompetitiveness Program. We are incredibly pleased to have the support of AAFC and to see a stronger focus on farm business management.

FMC's Key Result Areas under AgriCompetitiveness:

PROJECTS AND PROGRAMS



AGRICULTURAL EXCELLENCE CONFERENCE

The 2018 Agricultural Excellence Conference was hosted in Winnipeg, Manitoba November 26-28, welcoming over 280 farm management enthusiasts from across Canada to hear from leading experts and exchange insights on what it takes to succeed in today's increasingly competitive and ever-changing global marketplace.



The Conference theme, Ready? Steady. Go! focused on building the capacity of our farmers to confront change with confidence and seize opportunity towards sustainable growth and prosperity. Conference-goers came away from AgEx equipped with practical information and tools to enhance their farm business practices and unleash their potential.

The Conference welcomed delegates from 8 provinces and territories. This year also saw delegates from the United States, with representation from North Dakota and Texas.

68% of delegates were 40 years of age or under. This number is higher than usual as AgEx had the pleasure of welcoming 57 students from the University of Manitoba and 49 students from Assiniboine Community College. 39% of attendees were female.

The vast majority of delegates were farmers, representing a variety of production sectors including beef, dairy, grains & oilseeds, horticulture, poultry, hog, and fruit.

The Agenda focused on providing diverse learning experiences for participants.







In addition to keynote presentations, the Conference offered the Farm Business Management Resource Showcase, two Panel Discussions, Concurrent Workshops and Coaches on Call. Overall, 35 new learning resources were shared with participants.

I will be recommending other producers attend future FMC conferences. I think future farmers will be required to be as good at business management (debt management, cost control, marketing) as production practices. I find it very important to get away from the farm to reevaluate priorities. They can make the most of their experience by showing up early and staying late. We got a great deal of value out of networking with attendees.



ONLINE FARM BUSINESS SELF-ASSESSMENT TOOL AVAILABLE TO HELP FARMERS PLAN FOR SUCCESS!

Growing Your Farm Profits (GYFP): Planning for Business Success Online Farm Business Self-Assessment Tool provides producers with the first step in the business planning process. Producers will come away with a

comprehensive assessment of their farm business practices, priorities, key goals and ultimately, an Action Plan as a starting point towards the farm's business plan.



Producers can complete the online assessment on their own, or alternatively invite other members of the farm team to complete the assessment so that they can compare results before creating their roadmap to success; their business plan. Comparing assessments can lead to positive discussions regarding the future of the farm and ensure everyone's perspective is taken into account.

Once completed, the Action Plan can be submitted for validation. Producers may be eligible for cost-share opportunities to hire a consultant or to participate in training and learning events to improve their business practices.
