ONTARIO'S AGRI-FOOD MANAGEMENT INSTITUTE (AMI) WINDING DOWN

After over ten years of serving the agri-food sector in Ontario, the Agri-Food Management Institute (AMI) will be winding down and transferring its resources to industry allies.

Farm Management Canada has partnered with AMI on various projects in the past. A joint study (Dollars and Sense) established the first-ever link between farm business management and profitability, and identified the top seven habits of Canada's most successful farmers. Other successful AMI initiatives included the popular Advanced Farm Management Program, a series of regional food business-focused conferences, and a widely used program that supported the inclusion of business management topics and speakers at industry events.

Farm Management Canada has been identified as an ideal host for the farm-related reports, online training tools and other resources that AMI has developed to continue to provide value to Ontario's farmers. Food Processing Skills Canada will be the new host of the management tools for processors.

AMI had its start as a funding program dedicated to farm business management and administered by the Agricultural Adaptation Council. After becoming a stand-alone organization with support from the provincial and federal governments, AMI focused its activities on farm business management training and awareness, and eventually saw its mandate expand to include food and beverage processing businesses as well.

The Agri-food Management Institute will cease operations effective April 30, 2019 and encourages interested parties to contact Farm Management Canada or Food Processing Skills Canada for program or training information.

The International Farm Management Congress takes place every two years in host countries around the world. The objective of the Congress is to further the knowledge and understanding of farm business management and to exchange ideas and information about farm management theory and practice throughout the world.

The 22nd Congress was held March 3-8 in Launceston, Tasmania. The Pre-Congress tour led delegates along the east coast of Tasmania, while the Post-Congress tour led delegates around the southeast of Australia's mainland.

Canada was represented by a dozen Conference attendees including farmers, advisors, academics, the non-profit sector and private industry.

Farm Management Canada presented two papers:

Farm Management Canada also helped host a roundtable discussion on how to grow agriculture, and for the first time, the Congress hosted a Next Gens program to help the next generation of agricultural leaders connect, inspire and be inspired.
