

At a Glance:

Russian oilseeds generally offer positive margins and rank well compared with other crops. Sunflowers remain an attractive option for Russian growers, and overall acreage is likely to increase, although a reduction in sunflower acreage is likely in some regions and, in fact, there are signals that this change in trend has already started. As a result, adoption of more intensive practices leading to higher yields will be a primary factor in further growth.


Soybeans and rapeseed are relatively new crops for most regions. Despite this lack of experience, both crops have seen a tremendous growth in acreage and yield. Like sunflowers, soybeans offer a low-cost, higher margin alternative for producers, whereas rapeseed requires a greater up-front investment.

For both soybeans and rapeseed, varieties, production systems and equipment need further development and producers face a learning curve. It is likely that current growth will continue into 2025, but with regional differences tied to agronomic conditions, the economic situation on the farms and production risk considerations.

The platform covers 6 risk families including People, Finance, Market, Business Management, Business Environment and Production, and breaks those down into 19 risk categories. Each of these risk categories, including Personal Well-Being, Hired Labour, Money Management, Sourcing, Selling & Trade, Environment & Climate, Pest & Disease Management, is further broken down into risk scenarios with best management practices and helpful resources. These resources include a variety of options, from government programs to industry tools, to processes and procedures for taking a proactive approach to managing risk.

The pilot phase of the project will continue until March 2019, while gathering feedback from a select group of users to improve its functionality and form, and to ensure that it meets the risk management needs of the agricultural sector.





FMC hosted its quarterly teleconference on June 5th.
