BOARD AND GOVERNANCE

Farm Management Canada's annual Board of Directors meeting took place in conjunction with the annual Agricultural Excellence Conference in Fredericton, New Brunswick.

The Board reviewed progress towards deliverables and the overall financial strength and sustainability of the organization. Agriculture & Agri-Food Canada participated in an ex-officio capacity.

The Board will be undertaking a strategic planning exercise in the spring to review the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats of the organization in preparation for the renewal of a Contribution Agreement under AgriCompetitiveness and opportunities elsewhere for support.

THE CANADIAN AGRICULTURAL PARTNERSHIP

The 5-year Canadian Agricultural Partnership (CAP) program commenced April 1, 2018.

The Provinces and Territories are offering cost-share funding to support fostering business development via:

- Advisory services (individual farmers)
- Training and skills development (individual farmers)
- Training and skills development (organizations and associations)

We have compiled a list of P/T cost-share opportunities supporting business development available here.

Farm Management Canada secured a 3-year Contribution Agreement (2018-21) under AgriCompetitiveness in support of the bulk of our farm business management support activities.

We will continue to be a champion for farm business management and offer flagship programming including the annual AgEx Conference, Agriwebinars, and publications.

We have taken on some exciting new initiatives, recently launching our National Farm Leadership Program. Our Farm Financial Toolkit is well underway, along with our Mental Health & Farm Management Study and Dollars & Sense Study Update.

We were also successful in securing a 4-year Contribution Agreement (2019-23) under AgriRisk to enhance farm risk management education.

We look forward to the embarking on the following new activities in 2020:

- A Farm Transition Toolkit
- Minority Groups Study Meeting the Farm Business Management Needs of Indigenous Populations

AGRICULTURAL EXCELLENCE CONFERENCE

NATIONAL CONFERENCE FOCUSES ON CULTIVATING RESILIENCE IN CANADA'S AGRICULTURAL INDUSTRY

The 2019 Agricultural Excellence Conference was hosted in Fredericton, New Brunswick December 2-4 welcoming over 170 farm management enthusiasts from across Canada to hear from leading experts and exchange insights on today's hot topics affecting farm businesses. The Conference theme, *Cultivating Resilience* was an opportunity for delegates to focus on building the capacity to weather any storm - to confront change with confidence and seize opportunity.

The Conference opened with greetings from the Honourable Ross Wetmore, New Brunswick's Minister of Agriculture, Aquaculture and Fisheries and Chris van den Heuvel, 2nd Vice President of the Canadian Federation of Agriculture. Participants were also welcomed to Premier Blaine Higgs' open house, featuring New Brunswick's finest agricultural products.

In addition to keynote presentations, the Conference offered the National Farm Business Management Resource Showcase, a

Panel Discussion and Concurrent Workshops. Over 40 new learning resources were shared with participants. The delegate book included information on speakers and topics as well as 'thought spots' to record ideas and practical take-aways to improve current practices.



What participants had to say...

Project Update: ROOTS TO SUCCESS

TAKING A COMPREHENSIVE APPROACH TO MANAGING FARM RISK

Funded under the AgriRisk Initiative as part of the Canadian Agricultural Partnership, the Roots to Success project will make meaningful progress towards improved risk management for the agriculture and agri-food sector by promoting a comprehensive approach to managing risk. This project will use a state-of-the-art risk management platform to provide farmers and professionals that work directly with farmers with much-needed training to identify, assess, prioritize risks and create comprehensive risk management plans. The project will also serve to establish industry benchmarks using baseline date to identify opportunities for policy and program improvement to meet the risk management needs of Canada's farmers. This includes looking at ways to establish linkages with industry initiatives including the government's BRM programs.

LITERATURE REVIEW

Our literature review is nearing completion. The review looked at risk assessments previously completed by industry stakeholder groups, including projects under AgriRisk Initiatives to ensure our risk management platform includes all identified risks and best practices.

SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE INITIATIVE COMPLIANCE

The project team has identified a handful of best practices that will be added to our risk management platform in order to achieve compliance.

NATIONAL RISK MANAGEMENT ROUNDTABLE

A national Roundtable comprised of a diverse cross-section of sector players with a common goal – to guide the industry towards comprehensive risk management has been formed. The Roundtable will meet on a regular basis throughout the 4-year to discuss how to drive a comprehensive approach to managing risk for Canada's agricultural sector and to serve in an advisory capacity to the project, evaluating and monitoring progress towards meeting project goals.

The first Roundtable meeting was held by teleconference on December 19th, 2019 and the group will convene in-person for the first time in Ottawa on March 4th, 2020.

TRAINING AND WORKSHOPS

Farm Management Canada will be conducting a series of workshops to train producers on risk assessment and the implementation of a comprehensive risk management plan for their farm, and to train professionals offering consultative services to farmers to use a comprehensive risk management approach with their clients. A series of 40 workshops will be conducted over the next three years.

This workshop series is in partnership with Do More Agriculture in which we look to engage and educate farmers and the agricultural community at large in support of mental health in rural communities.

Farmers are the backbone of our rural communities. However, our farmers are facing risk and uncertainty like never-before, from Mother Nature to changing markets and regulations, much of which is outside of their control. Public trust is now putting more pressure on farmers. A recent University of Guelph study shows farmers suffer from higher rates of stress, anxiety, and depression than the general population. This incredible stress is jeopardizing our farmers' health and likewise, the health of our rural communities.

A variety of speakers with diverse backgrounds in Mental Health, Farm Business Management and Community Support will help workshop participants recognize the signs of stress and build the knowledge, skills and practices to gain the confidence to assist one another and build a local support network, while putting measures in place to support their own mental health.

Workshops were hosted in Kemptville and Kawartha Lakes (Eastern Ontario) on January 20 and 22.

Project Update: EXPLORING THE CONNECTION BETWEEN MENTAL HEALTH AND FARM BUSINESS MANAGEMENT

ENVIRONMENTAL SCAN REVEALS LACK OF RESEARCH EXPLORING MENTAL HEALTH AND FARM MANAGEMENT

In response to new knowledge about the state of farmers' mental health in Canada, Farm Management Canada is examining the connection between mental health and farm business management. The goal of this research is to develop an understanding of the relationship between farm business management practices and farmer mental health. This question is being explored from both sides of the relationship. For example, how does effective farm business management impact or support farmer mental health? As well as conversely, how does mental well-being impact or support farm business decision-making?



The purpose of the Environmental Scan was to provide a review of the existing research and programs across Canada and around the world relating to farmer mental health and farm business management, and to identify and leverage any existing research connecting the two.

The Scan includes information on mental health, farmer mental health, stress factors, farm business management practices, decision-making, and more specifically, how these topics relate to one-another.

The insights gathered from the Scan are being used to inform the next phase of this project, which involve a nationwide survey, focus groups and one-on-one interviews. The Scan also identifies knowledge gaps beyond the scope of this project that may help inform subsequent research.

Results reveal there is likely an inherent connection between mental health and managing the farm, but this link has not been explored in research.

Three main gaps were identified for further exploration:

- Gap 1: The limited scope of research related to mental health in Canadian Agriculture
- Gap 2: The connection between mental health and farm management
- Gap 3: The effectiveness of mental health support programs & resources.

Provincial-Territorial Ministry membership to Farm Management Canada is the only way to connect with fellow Ministries across Canada to build relationships, share knowledge, foster new ideas, collaborate and leverage resources to continue to advance farm business management, programs and initiatives for farmers in each Province/Territory and Canada as a whole.

Farm Management Canada hosted its annual P/T Ministry Network meeting on December 5, immediately following the 2019 AgEx Conference in Fredericton, New Brunswick. Representatives shared insights relating to business management programming (availability, uptake and any changes), new initiatives and opportunities for collaboration. Representatives were present from Yukon, British Columbia, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island.

Isabelle Beriau, Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada provided a CAP programming update on the AgriCompetiveness and AgriDiversity Programs.

Heather Watson, Executive Director, provided an update on Farm Management Canada's activities and programs including the organization's ultimate goals, observations on barriers and drivers of adoption of farm business practices, and opportunities for collaboration.

The P/T Network nominated Brad Barton to remain as the Government representative to the Farm Management Canada Board of Directors.

Open discussion surrounded the importance of farm business management and concern over the lack of business management programming in some Provinces and Territories. The Network noted the importance of advocating for farm business management to be included as its own pillar in the Next Policy Framework (CAP 2) so that programming is carried forward into the bilateral agreements.

We will be working to renew the Provincial or Territorial memberships early in 2020 to sustain the P/T Network and this very important mechanism to share best practices, providing Canada's farmers with equal opportunity for continued excellence.
