INSIGHTS FROM THE

2019 INTERNATIONAL CASH CROP CONFERENCE - GLOBAL FORUM EXPLORING CANADA'S COMPETITIVE EDGE: HOW DO WE STACK UP?

"Innovations in cropping systems needed internationally" - This is one of the most important lessons learned during the annual agri benchmark Cash Crop Conference, which took place from June 24th to June 27th in Winnipeg. This Conference, jointly organized by Farm Management Canada and the agri benchmark Network, gathered more than 50 international scientific partners participating to discuss latest results from international benchmarking, as well as strategic challenges in global crop production. Listed below are some insights derived from the Conference.

New cropping systems needed

The conference revealed the necessity of innovative cropping systems on a global scale and that is no longer solely a (Western) European issue driven by politics. A comprehensive report on issues in global rapeseed production shows that systems that heavily rely on plant protection products are under pressure because of increasing resistances against weeds, pests and diseases. This adds to a thin pipeline of new products and growing political concerns against existing products.

GM-free soybeans - an attractive market in the EU

agri benchmark analysis shows that the European market for GM-free soybean meal is an already rather sizeable market (approx. 20%) traded annually and is rapidly growing due to the use of GM-free feedstock as a marketing tool in the retail and food processing industries.

Beyond meat and Co: Driver for global plant protein markets

Global markets for plant proteins for human consumption are set to grow very fast – both in terms of quantity and value. Currently, Canada is well-positioned to be a key supplier to meet this demand due to highly competitive producers of these crops and a consumer-driven mindset in the value chain. However, it is important to note that this position – at least as far as production is concerned – is not unchallenged. Growers in Siberia (Russia), as well as those in Northern Kazakhstan are theoretically able to produce pulses at competitive costs. Presently, limiting factors are transportation and logistics.

Corn production on the rise

agri benchmark data indicates corn is outcompeting with wheat at the farm-level in the northern regions of the USA, as well as in Canada and the Ukraine. There are three main drivers for this development: (a) the considerable growth of Russian wheat production and, subsequently, exports that put pressure on global wheat prices; (b) the ongoing success of breeding companies to adapt corn to new climatic conditions; thereby, substantially increasing yields and, at the same time, (c) wheat yield increases are moderate.

Chinese government is boosting domestic soybean production

In view of the US-China trade conflict, the Chinese government is massively subsidizing soybean production. Data from Chinese agri benchmark partners indicate that from 2016 to 2019, soybean subsidies went from 250 USD/ha to 600 USD/ha; while at the same time, corn subsidies have been reduced from 250/ha to 150 USD/ha. Therefore, Chinese producers started to expand soybean acreage and will continue to do so. In the long-run this will lead to a deficit in Chinese corn production, ultimately prompting demand for corn imports. In the short-term, however, no significant impact on corn markets will be experienced: Due to the reduction of the Chinese pork population resulting from the outbreak of African Swine Fever, less feed is needed.

About the Workshops

Farmers are the backbone of rural communities. However, our farmers are facing risk and uncertainty like never-before, from Mother Nature to changing markets and regulations, much of which is outside their control. Public trust is now putting more pressure on farmers. A recent University of Guelph study shows farmers suffer from higher rates of stress, anxiety, and depression than the general population. This incredible stress is jeopardizing our farmers' health and likewise, the health of rural communities.

There is a stigma around mental health in the agricultural community - one that must be brought to light, so we can work towards solutions and greater support. When it comes to farming, the effects of mental health go beyond the individual. The business must keep going, the team must be led, the animals must be fed, crops managed, cows milked and local community and economy supported. Farm business management facilitates mental preparedness, reducing stress and the physical, mental, emotional and behaviour consequences thereof.

These workshops will help community members recognize the signs of stress and build the knowledge, skills and practices to gain the confidence to assist one another and build a local support network, while putting measures in place to support their own mental health.

EXPLORING THE CONNECTION BETWEEN MENTAL HEALTH AND FARM BUSINESS MANAGEMENT

Our research project is well underway with a series of engagement pieces complete and coming up.

On September 26, we brought together our Advisory Committee to discuss the methodology and scope of the project. We learned from each other and explored the knowledge of those in the room, who represent various production sectors, commodity groups and associations from across Canada.

On October 8, members of our research team attended the annual CASA (Canadian Agricultural Safety Association) conference in Quebec City to host our first Focus Group. We spoke with Farm Safety advocates to discuss the potential impacts of mental health on farm business management as well as conversely, how farm business management affects

farmer mental health. The session was hosted in English but simultaneously translated into French, as there were about 40% attendees who spoke French.



Our National Survey will be delivered by FCC through their Vision Panel. The survey will be released early December 2019, so stayed tuned to our emails to ensure you receive proper instructions on how to participate.


