Hello everyone,

With my mix of personal, family, and professional responsibilities, I can sometimes feel caught up in an endless cycle of to-do lists. There's always that next item on the list that feels pressing to tackle.

A task-based orientation can be crucial to managing daily operations and, in some ways, it can simplify the pressures you face. 






















#### MANITOBA'S MICHELE ROGALSKY RECOGNIZED FOR HER CONTRIBUTION TO FARM MANAGEMENT EXCELLENCE WITH PRESTIGIOUS WILSON LOREE AWARD

Farm Management Canada recently held its annual Agricultural Excellence Conference where Michele Rogalsky was announced as the 2022 recipient of the prestigious Wilson Loree Award. Now in its twentieth year, the Award honours individuals or groups who have made an extraordinary contribution to advancing farm business management in Canada.

Michele has dedicated her career to the advancement of agricultural education and training, retiring in 2022 from the University of Manitoba, School of Agriculture after 33 years of service. She spearheaded a critical revitalization of the two-year Diploma in Agriculture program, transforming the curriculum into one of the top applied farm management and production agriculture training programs in Canada. As part of the renewed curriculum, Michele engaged with industry technology partners to integrate digital agriculture which resulted in a new course titled "Agricultural Technologies for Farm Management Decision Making" which has brought together agricultural tech firms with students to explore and evaluate instrumentation and digital analysis platforms at the University of Manitoba's Carman research station and on their own farms.

Under her guidance, the School of Agriculture has established itself as a farm safety education and training leader, and Michele facilitated a collaboration with Brodenhead Ojibway Nation to incorporate growing Indigenous foods and medicines, exploring sustainable food systems, nutrition, land stewardship and business practices.

According to student feedback, Michele's farm instructors made one of the best pivots to deliver effective online offerings during the COVID shutdowns on campus. Most of her current team of instructors were mentored by Michele as her students.

Throughout her career, Michele served on a number of industry Boards including the Canadian Agricultural Safety Association, the Canadian Agricultural Human Resources Council, and as Chair of the Canadian Association of Diplomas in Agriculture Program.

Michele was nominated by Derek Brewin, Chris Hamblin, and Martin Scanlon to receive the 2022 Wilson Loree Award.

Wilson is cited as "an individual who exemplifies innovation, wisdom, and a constant focus on the farm manager and the farm family." Currently Wilson resides in Calgary, Alberta.

Farm Credit Canada presented a session titled **Handing over the keys: Transferring knowledge in farm transition**, presented by FCC Business Advisor Annessa Good.

Farmers, organizations, agribusinesses and ag media joined in FTADay, sharing their farm transition success stories, tips, resources and tools to create a coast-to-coast buzz around farm transition and encourage Canada's farmers to continue their transition journey.

From registering for the program, you will benefit from a deeper understanding of your financial situation and the different options available to remain competitive and take calculated risks for continued success. Through the Farm Financial Fluency program, you will learn:

- ✓ Why financial reporting is important and to whom
- ✓ Key differences between types of financial reporting and who uses what
- ✓ Different farm business structures and their impact on financial reporting

The Roots to Success project is making meaningful progress towards improved risk management for the agriculture and agri-food sector by promoting a comprehensive approach to managing risk. 

Recent events like COVID-19, supply disruptions, inflation and increased interest rates have highlighted the importance of being prepared for change, to increase the capacity to build resilience of our farms, and to not only be ready to face the challenges ahead, but to be ready to seize the opportunities that may present themselves along with those challenges. This is why Farm Management Canada has created AgriResponse.ca, a new website designed to answer questions from Canadian producers on contingency planning, emergency preparedness and generally becoming more resilient when facing uncertainty.

The AgriResponse website will help to gather the needs and concerns of Canadian producers through an online venue where they can ask questions or vote for questions submitted by other producers and receive responses directly from industry experts in order to find the best ways to prepare themselves for uncertainty.

#### Carbon farming: The way of the future?

The urgent need for a reduction of greenhouse gas emissions has increased the pressure across the globe on businesses in every sector and governments at every level to make changes to how they operate toward reducing or eliminating environmental impacts. Agriculture is among those sectors most affected by this momentum of change, not only because of its significant impacts on people, economies, and on the natural environment, but because it is an immediately available "technology" that can significantly influence global carbon levels for the better.

#### What the transformation of protein production means for livestock producers

Recent years have seen a flurry of activity in the alternative proteins space, from scrambled eggs made from mung beans[1] to meat grown in a lab.[2] Biorefined or cultured proteins refer to proteins found naturally in meat, eggs, or dairy, but grown in biofoundries or bioreactors using yeasts, bacteria, or stem cells. The resulting products are nearly identical to that produced via conventional means, i.e., animal husbandry, but may be modified to, for example, have a healthier fat profile. These technologies have existed for some time in the biopharmaceutical sector to produce organs, tissues for medical interventions or proteins of pharmaceutical interest, but the technology has been refined to produce animal proteins as food ingredients at a commercial scale.


