Every two years, the International Farm Management Association (IFMA) selects a country to host its International Farm Management Congress.

Canada has been selected to host the 2024 Congress in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan in partnership with the College of Agricultural and Resource Economics at the University of Saskatchewan.



The Congress takes place over 6 days and attracts participants from across the globe.

The theme for the 24th Congress is Resilience Through Innovation. Topics of discussion will include resilient economies, institutions, ecosystems, farm businesses, farm families, communities and futures.

The plenary program is run over the course of three days (Monday, Wednesday and Friday) and includes a mixture of keynote presentations and discussion panels with invited speakers and concurrent contributed paper and poster sessions.

Delegates can choose their own learning path when it comes to the concurrent sessions. Academics, researchers, extension specialists, advisors, organizations, agribusinesses and government will present their applied and peer-reviewed papers and posters focusing on resilience-driven approaches to farm management under the following sub-themes:

On Tuesday and Thursday, delegates will participate in field trips to various farms, as well as research, agribusiness and educational facilities in the local area.

There is also a wonderful social program.

Sunday evening, we will gather for a welcome reception at the Wanuskewin Heritage Park where we will learn about the Indigenous peoples and culture of the area, enjoying local food and Indigenous dancing. Wednesday evening, we will head over to the Western Development Museum and be transported back to 1930s boomtown in an indoor replica village and museum. And Thursday, we will gather at the stunning Remai Modern Art gallery overlooking the river for the Congress Banquet (pictured below).

The Family Business Consultant Training Program guides farm advisors and consultants through helping their farming clients implement best practices in professionalizing family farm governance systems and support farm transition.

The goal of the training is to help you support farm and ranch owners in:

- Creating a governance structure to clarify roles, accountabilities and decision-making
- Professionalizing their business management practices
- Managing family dynamics and conflict in the business
- Preparing for business transition and succession planning

The next training session is scheduled for May 14-15, 2024 in Kansas City. The class is limited to 25 participants, and the registration investment is \$2,000 plus travel costs (\$1,500 for returning alumni).

AgriStability and AgriInvest Program Changes under the Sustainable Canadian Agricultural Partnership (Sustainable CAP)

In July 2022, Ministers agreed to a new 5-year national agricultural policy framework agreement, the Sustainable Canadian Agricultural Partnership (Sustainable CAP), which launched on April 1, 2023. Under the new framework, initial changes to the AgriStability Program came into effect for the 2023 program year and new changes will be coming for the 2024 program year (in provinces where the program is administered by AAFC). And, new changes to the AgriInvest Program will be coming in the 2025 program year.
