

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

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE 24TH INTERNATIONAL FARM MANAGEMENT CONGRESS



Every two years, the International Farm Management Association (IFMA) selects a country to host its International Farm Management Congress. The Congress takes place over 6 days (Sunday to Friday) and attracts participants from across the globe. There is also a 6-day pre-Congress tour for delegates interested in seeing more of the host country.

Canada was selected to host the 2024 Congress in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan in partnership with the College of Agricultural and Resource Economics at the University of Saskatchewan. Under the theme **Resilience Through Innovation**, topics of discussion includes resilient economies, institutions, ecosystems, farm businesses, farm families, communities and futures.

The pre-Congress tour started in Regina and wound its way around Saskatchewan to land in Saskatoon for the main Congress. The plenary program ran over the course of three days (Monday, Wednesday and Friday) and included a mixture of keynote presentations and discussion panels with invited speakers and concurrent contributed paper and poster sessions.
