TOP 5 HIGHLIGHTS OF AGEX 2024

AgEx 2024 featured many exciting moments, and we appreciate the support and engagement of attendees.

1. OPENING RECEPTION, BANQUET DINNER AND BC MARKETPLACE

At the opening reception, attendees enjoyed local oysters from the BC Shellfish Growers Association and explored products from 15 local vendors at our first-ever AgEx Marketplace.







The Banquet dinner at AgEx is always a highlight, known for its unique format that encourages mingling while enjoying food from stations around the room. This year, the dinner featured a Coast-to-Coast theme, with stations showcasing foods from across Canada. Highlights included a beef station representing Alberta, pasta from the Prairies, charcuterie from Quebec and Ontario, and seafood from the East and West coasts.










Her leadership has driven the development of partnerships, innovative programs and technical resources and services that have empowered First Nations communities, businesses, and individuals to strengthen Indigenous food systems, enhance agricultural success, and improve food sovereignty. Through Erica's work, key programs and initiatives have been launched that reflect her deep commitment to advancing reconciliation and Indigenous rights within the agriculture sector.

Wilson Loree proudly presented Erica with the 2024 Wilson Loree Award on November 20, 2024 during the Agricultural Excellence Conference.

TAKE A COMPREHENSIVE APPROACH TO MANAGING FARM RISK

Managing farm risk is essential for the long-term sustainability and profitability of agricultural operations. Farms face a variety of risks, including weather-related events, market price fluctuations, pests, diseases, and changes in government regulations. Effective risk management means taking a proactive approach to managing risk both mitigate possible negative impacts and to benefit from potential rewards.

Successful farmers understand the different types of risk they face and put measures in place to manage them.




